SPIRITUAL GIFTS #1: WORDS OF WISDOM

Read 1 Cor. 12:4-11

Definition

- * It is not a permanent gift. There is no definite article (lit. 'a word of wisdom')
- * It is spoken. *Logos* = word, message, statement
- * It is wise. *Sophia* = wisdom, prudence, enlightenment
- * It is beneficial. Wisdom always results in welfare
- * Such wisdom was promised by Jesus (Luke 21:12-15) and evidenced by the apostles (Acts 6:10)
- * A word of wisdom is an utterance relevant to a given need that supernaturally applies the healing and reconciling qualities of wisdom to that need

1/The importance of wisdom

- * Wisdom is supreme
- * See Proverbs 4:7: 'The beginning of wisdom is this: Get wisdom, and whatever you get, get insight.'
- * Proverbs 8:11: 'For wisdom is better than jewels, and all that you may desire cannot compare with her.'
- * We are all encouraged to pray for it (James 1:5-7)
- * Eg Mrs Harris concerning her husband Leo Harris 'He was always praying for wisdom.'
- * A word of wisdom is one that excels 'normal' wisdom
- * Examples of Solomon (1 Kings 3:16ff); Jesus (Matt 21:23ff; 22:19)

2/The wisdom of God

- * God's wisdom is seen primarily in the cross of Christ
- * A word of wisdom is always Christ-centred
- * Rev 19:11
- * See 1 Cor. 1:22-25, 30 ('He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, whom God made our wisdom and our righteousness and sanctification and redemption').
- * Story of incident in Hyde Park (see Barry Chant, Spiritual Gifts Tabor 2002:32, 33)

3/The nature of wisdom

- Wisdom is shown by actions
- * Not what we say but what we do that counts
- * 'Actions speak louder than words.'
- * See James 3:13: 'Who is wise and understanding among you? *By his good conduct* let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom...'

4/Marks of 'earthly wisdom'

- * See James 3:13-18
- * Bitter jealousy/envy

- * Selfish ambition
- * Boasting
- * Falsity
- * Earthly
- * Unspiritual
- * Demonic
- * Disorder
- * Evil practice
- * See 1 Sam 18:1-16. It was Saul's envy and ambition that brought about discord and disorder and eventually his own downfall.

5/Marks of godly wisdom

- * See James 3:13-18
- * Meek/humble
- * Pure
- * Peace-loving
- * Gentle
- * Submissive/open to reason
- * Full of mercy
- * Full of good fruits
- * Impartial
- * Sincere
- * Righteous
- * Even a child can value these qualities
- * Wise people are those who display them
- * Words of wisdom will also reflect these qualities
- * Who do you know who is wise?

6/Using words of wisdom

- Prav
- Believe
- Ask questions
- Obey the Spirit
- * Example of two ministers who could not agree, although both good men. When I prayed about it I suddenly saw that the problem was they had quite different ideas of the nature of ministry. This was the solution to the problem (see *Spiritual Gifts* 2002:41).

Remember...

- * Proverbs 4:7: The beginning of wisdom is this: Get wisdom, and whatever you get, get insight.
- * Proverbs 8:11: For wisdom is better than jewels, and all that you may desire cannot compare with her.

Challenge

- * We need to pray for wisdom all the time (James 1:5-7)
- * We need to be Christ-centred (1 Cor 1:30)

- * We need to live wisely (James 3:13-17)
- * We need to be filled with the Holy Spirit (Eph 5:18)
- * We also need words of wisdom at times of special need
- * Let's trust God for his wisdom today!

SOMETHING TO THINK OR TALK ABOUT

Read: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11; James 3:13-18 Biblical

- 1. What evidence is there that Paul believed in the Holy Trinity? (1 Cor 12:4-6)
- 2. Why are manifestations of the Holy Spirit given? (7)
- 3. Why do you think a word of wisdom is the first gift to be listed? (8)
- 4. What can we learn from comparing the qualities of divine wisdom and the qualities of earthly 'wisdom' (James 3:13-18).
- 5. Why do you think envy and ambition produce evil and disorder? (16) 1 Samuel 18:9 might be of interest here.)
- 6. What does verse 18 mean?

Personal and Practical

- 7. Which of the qualities of wisdom seems most important to you? (James 3:13-17) Why?
- 8. Can you think of examples of people who have exemplified one of these qualities? Share your example with the group.
- 9. The word 'submissive' (NIV) or 'open to reason' (ESV) can also mean 'willing to yield' (NRSV) or 'willing to give way.' How does this work out in practice?
- 10. The original Greek word for 'sincere' is *anupokrites*. What can you comment about this? (Say the word aloud and you will have a clue.)
- 11. Recount any examples you have experienced of words of wisdom ie an expression of unusual wisdom that obviously came from the Holy Spirit.

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
