Now here's another suggestion. You can also do this one around the table or at church or in your youth group and it can involve everyone. Adults can do it; young people can do it; kids can do it. Strangers can do it (Luke 14:13). Warning: You may need an interpreter if you don't speak Aussie.

So what is it? It's is a dinkum Aussie skit called *While Stockmen Watched their Mob One Night*. You can perform it **as a family** after Christmas dinner. Just clear a space in your lounge room or your back patio and go for it. Three people can play the role of shepherds; others can be angels; someone can read the Bible; everyone can be in the choir; and there is need for at least one techie, one soloist and one musician. (If you don't have a musician, sing the songs anyway.) This could be a great way to involve dinner guests who might be uncomfortable with a straight Bible reading or prayer.

Just make copies of the script, assign the roles and read the parts. There's no need to memorise the lines but it could be a good idea to practice them once or twice beforehand, especially the songs.

The play is also ideal for a Christmas celebration for **School, Sunday School, Youth and other groups and Church.** In these cases, the parts could be memorised and acted out properly and the musicians well-rehearsed beforehand. Costuming is a cinch. Props are minimal.

May: Sydney CRC pastoral gathering; Portlife CRC church 60th anniversary celebration in SA. (Barry was the second pastor of this church 1963-1975)

July: Barry and his brother Ken taught at Winter School at Adelaide Christian Centre (CRC). B and V visited the growing Georgetown Baptist Church (Penang) pastored by a Tabor graduate (see photo). Also River of Life church and the huge Full Gospel Assembly

Our Indian tenants, who had become like family to us, moved on; we renovated our 'granny flat'; our granddaughter Ness came to live with us.

October: Vanessa had heart surgery, from which she has recovered well. Ministry every Sunday at various churches including Living Word (African), Shellharbour (CRC), River of Life (Crosslink).

November: Ministry at various churches including Wesley International Congregation, where we had pastored for eight years and a Holy Spirit seminar at Kingston City Church (CRC) in Melbourne. Another Sydney CRC pastoral gathering

December: Scheduled Sunday ministry at Life Christian Centre and Austral-Asian Community Church, both in Adelaide.
